Offering HOPE to the Family in Need, the Sick and the Homeless

A sad story of a wonderful family

It's not easy for me to find the right words to share the story of an extraordinary family, with three wonderful children, that have experienced a tragic event – the loss of the mother.

Todor family, made up of the father **Octavian** – 36 years old, and three children: **Miriam** – five years and a half, **Samuel** – four years and **Estera** – two and half years. They all live in a house in Alparea, about 8 miles from Cihei.

Two months ago, **Mirela**, their wife and mother, only 32 years old, left this Earth for Heaven, to be with her beloved Lord. She suffered with problematical lungs and after a very severe cold, her situation dramatically deteriorated. The ambulance came and took her to the hospital, but one day later, she left feeling better, but also because she was worried about the children at home. Getting back home, only hours later, she was again very sick. She asked the husband to help her sit down in an armchair, to rest and very soon she went into a coma. They thought she was asleep but realised the reality only the next day, when they took her to the hospital again. But it was too late. The doctors could not do anything for her.

Someone that knew of **Smiles**, asked us to help this family. What help could we offer? During such times it's just enough to be present, even if you are speechless. The fact that we were there, talking to them and comforting them counted a lot. We found a special family, but a very sad and hurting one, even if they did not talk much, it was so obvious. You could see it, even feel it.

We noticed their needs: for clothing, food, pampers, play toys. We went back there and we spent a nice time together, playing with the children and at least for some minutes, the father could relax a little bit.

There are a lot of sensitive people and they tell us about situations like this one. For this particular family, we want to stay with them for a longer period of time. Surely, there's nothing or no one that could replace their mother, but there are things we can do to help them face this difficult situation.

Mr. Octavian had to give up his job, to stay at home with the children. He has no qualifications, so he was doing only hard work jobs, but still, that was a welcomed income, that is now lost. Now, the only income the family has is the allowance from the state for the children, approximately £30/\$45 a month.

The children were very much attached to their mother, Miriam is still asking about her.

Where is mum, when is she coming back?

The father tried to explain she is in heaven now, and she is not coming back, and only they will go to be with her one day. And then, she asked again: **is it long until we will go too?** There are things too difficult even for us as adults to understand, so much more so for the children.

Octavian lost his family's support because he became a Christian. Even now, his mother would not help him with the children unless he paid her. So, he will have to stay at home with the children for a while, and later on, the

children will go to the nursery/kindergarten and he will find a job. He has some friends that will take care of the little ones for some hours when he needs.

There is a time when the answers are hard to find, so we just decided to stay by this family. I trust there will be people touched by their story and together we will become a true blessing for them. We'll try to get support volunteers involved also, to stay with the children, to take them out in the city or do a picnic with them. Also, there will be a lot of other needs a single father will encounter raising his three children.

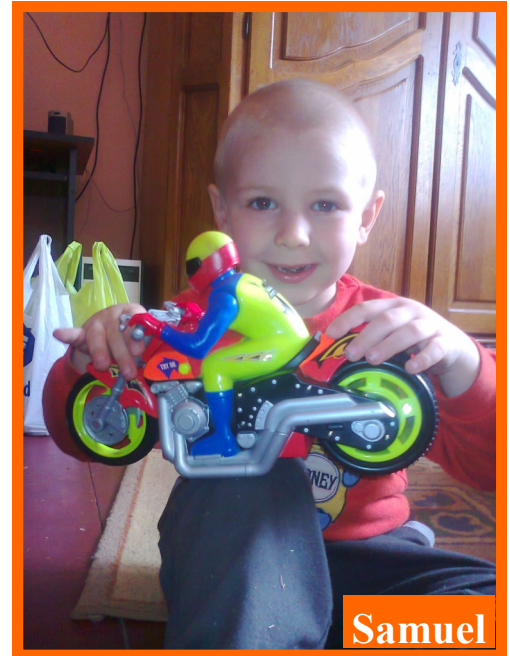
